🥦 Rose Notes from Maryellen Sherman, MG



Hello fellow gardeners.

Even though it seems really nice here in Rio Rancho, it is still too early to think about pushing the mulch away from your roses. Remember twice in the past week Albuquerque had snow. This is the time of year where the weather just keeps changing.

Now is a good time to check your irrigation drip lines for leaks or clogged emitters. If your emitters

are clogged just soak the tops in vinegar water or replace them.

DO NOT PRUNE this month! If your roses should start to really green up you might have to prune while you can still see the canes, but put off pruning as long as you can.

Carol Marr has scheduled a rose pruning demonstration in the Rose Garden at the Medaowlark Senior Center on April 4 at 1:15 p.m. You will hear more

about the rose pruning at a later date from Carol. I will be the presenter.

You can increase watering to once every two weeks, but check the soil for moisture frequently, so the soil doesn't completely dry out. Smile—spring is getting closer!
